ANHS Launches New Payment Plan Option

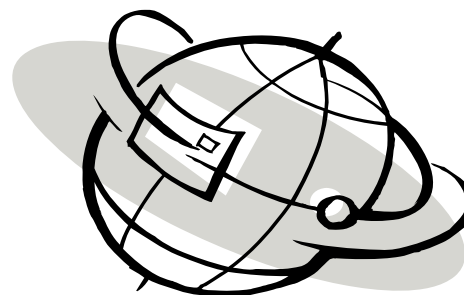

ANHS now offers a payment plan option for enrollment.

ANHS knows that tuition can be costly for some students in today's economy, and with the new payment plan option, ANHS will give many more students the opportunity to participate in our program.

The plan will allow students to enroll in courses with a low down payment. Then the remaining balance will be paid in monthly payments during the enrollment period.

Here is an example of how the payment plan



works: If you enroll in four courses, and wish to rent textbooks, the total amount due would be \$1,580.00. Using the payment plan, you would be able to pay \$430.00 as a down payment upon enrollment. Then you would pay five monthly payments of \$230.00. You would therefore be able to pay your balance off by the time you complete your courses and reach your deadline

date.

Both existing students and new students can participate in the plan.

report and conducting a successful site visit was not an easy task, and we have many faculty, staff, and volunteers to thank for their efforts and dedication to ANHS.

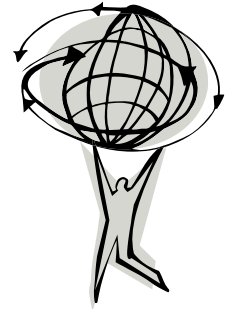
Thank you very much for your contribution to this successful effort.

College Prep: Options and Tools to Help Pay for School

You should understand all of your options when it comes to paying for college. There are a few different types of financial aid available to college students. There are loans (both subsidized and unsubsidized) grants, and scholarships.

ANHS recommends using the College Board website to research your options because it can help you get the latest information about college costs, scholarships, financial aid applications,

education loans, and college financing.

The College Board's Scholarship Search is an online tool to help you locate scholarships, internships, grants, and loans that match your education level, talents, and background.

Once you complete the brief questionnaire, it will find potential opportunities from their database of more than 2,300 sources of college funding, totaling nearly \$3

billion in available aid!

Keep in mind that the more information you enter, the better the odds that Scholarship Search will be able to match you to financial aid sources. So do not be shy, and be sure to complete all the sections of the questionnaire.

Career Paths: The Reinvented World of Real Estate

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, "One of the most complex and significant financial events in peoples' lives is the purchase or sale of a home or investment property. Because of the complexity and importance of this transaction, people typically seek the help of real estate brokers and sales agents when buying or selling real estate.

Real estate brokers and sales agents have a thorough knowledge of the real estate market in their communities. They know which neighborhoods will best fit clients' needs and budgets. They are familiar with local zoning and tax laws and know where to obtain financing for the purchase of property." <http://www.bls.gov/>

The Occupational Outlook Handbook, 2010-11 Edition states that, "Employment of real estate brokers and sales agents is expected to grow 14 percent during the 2008-18 decade, faster than average for all occupations. A growing population, particularly young adults who will be forming households in greater numbers, will require the services of real estate agents and brokers to buy their homes. In

addition to job growth, a large number of job openings will arise from the need to replace workers who transfer to other occupations or leave the labor force.

Median annual wages, including commissions, of salaried real estate brokers were \$57,500 in May 2008. The middle 50 percent earned between \$36,420 and \$93,970 a year." <http://www.bls.gov/oco/ocos120.htm#nature>

Many post-secondary institutions offer real estate courses to prepare students to obtain their license and offer specialized certificates within the field.
