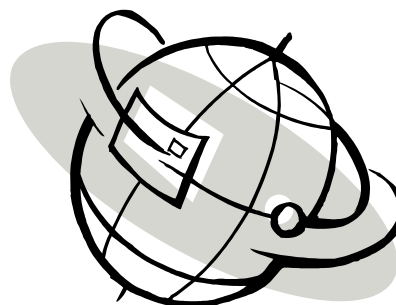

“Juniors:

- Take the PSAT/NMSQT®
- Get [PSAT/NMSQT tips and a free practice test](#).
- When taking the PSAT/NMSQT, sign up for [Student Search Service](#)® to hear from scholarship programs.
- Make lists of your abilities, preferences and personal qualities. List things you may want to study and do in college. Start planning by [reading about majors and careers](#).

- Use [College Search](#) to find colleges with the right characteristics.

Seniors:

- Complete your applications
- Narrow your [list of colleges](#) to approximately five to eight. Get an application and financial aid info from each. Visit as many as possible.
- Make a master [calendar](#) and note: Test dates, fees and deadlines, college application due dates, required [financial aid applications](#) and their

deadlines.

- Check your high school's deadlines for application requests, such as your transcript.
- Ask for [recommendations](#). Give each person your resume, a stamped and addressed envelope, and any required forms.
- Write [application essays](#) and ask teachers, family members and friends to read first drafts.”

Career Paths: Web Design

Do you want to learn how to create online graphic images, designs, and copy layouts?

"There are several different jobs that Web designers do. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, Web designers and developers are Computer Scientists and Database Administrators (Web Designers, Web Developers, and Webmasters), Desktop Publishers (Web Publications Designers), Writers and Editors (Web Writers), Computer Programmers (Web Programmers).

Of these job descriptions, computer scientists have a very good job outlook through 2016. According to the BLS:

Computer scientists and database administrators are projected to be one of the fastest growing occupations over the next decade.... The computer scientists and database administrators

occupation is expected to grow 37 percent from 2000 to 2016, much faster than average for all occupations.

Most Web designers have an associate degree. And if you're going to go the computer scientist route, most companies want a 4-year degree, although some will accept a 2-year program. If you're approaching Web design from the graphics design side, you'll definitely need a bachelor's degree. According to the BLS, you will face steep competition for graphic design jobs, and so again experience in Web design and computers will help you get the job.

Web designers who can also do computer science and database administration will be in higher demand than those designers who are strictly graphics and layout.

If you have good writing skills, becoming a Web writer is a great way to get into Web design. And if you

already know HTML and how to get your content onto websites, you'll be in higher demand." www.bls.gov and http://webdesign.about.com/od/jobs/a/web_design_jobs_2016_outlook.htm

ANHS and AAU have a dual enrollment program that will give you the background required for this occupation, beginning with Microsoft® courses and an HTML class at ANHS. Student then take an introductory course through AAU and complete the certificate program after graduation with AAU.

As a student of AAU's Web Design Certificate program you'll learn the basics that will help you determine the size and arrangement of illustrative material and copy. You'll learn the proper methods for selecting type, layout, and introducing aesthetic design concepts and be able to build your own web project.
